If so, we want to thank you! We know this is a big "ask." We also know you may have questions and possibly concerns. We're sharing this flyer in the hope that we can provide you with the information you need to make an informed decision. Know that even thinking about being Dawn's living kidney donor is a courageous step and we are grateful for you!

UPDATES

In February of 2019, Dawn's nephrologist diagnosed her with Glomerulonephritis ANCA Vasculitis. She was then put on dialysis in May of that same year and would go to the University of Utah Health for her treatments. Dawn was placed on the kidney transplant waiting list in June of 2019 and then, in August, she started PD dialysis.

WHY A LIVING DONOR?

Waiting 3-5 years for a kidney from a deceased donor is not the best path forward for Dawn. With a living donor, Dawn can get her kidney transplant sooner! Research has shown that when patients receive a kidney from a living donor, the outcome is generally better. Living kidney donation is also ideal because kidneys from living donors last longer and there is a lower chance Dawn's immune system will attack her new kidney (rejection).

COMMON QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

WAS DAWN'S FAMILY TESTED?

Unfortunately, members of Dawn's family are either not a match or too unhealthy to donate at this time. In some cases, the best living donor is one who is not a family member, even when family members do step forward to donate.

DO I NEED INSURANCE TO DONATE?

Yes, the hospital requires that you have insurance to be considered as a living donor in the event an unknown health issues comes up for the donor.

WHAT ABOUT MY EXPENSES?

While Dawn's insurance covers all costs related to the donation (for Dawn and the donor), there are expenses like travel, meals, and lost wages that you may be reimbursed for. There are resources available to ensure you are not paying for anything out of pocket. We can provide more information on those resources, if interested.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO DONATE?

The following are pre-qualification requirements for living donation: must be between the age of 18-69 years old, must be healthy and free of major health problems such as high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease, and obesity (BMI of 37 or less), and must be mentally and emotionally healthy.

HOW LONG IS THE RECOVERY PROCESS?

Living kidney donors are often able to return to work within 2 weeks, and fully heal within 6-8 weeks. After surgery, the donor's remaining kidney will also grow in size and function, allowing them to live normal life with just one kidney.

I HAVE NON-MEDICAL QUESTIONS ABOUT BECOMING A DONOR?

Visit Dawn's kidney website and complete the contact form. Within 1 business day, a donor advocate named Laurie will reach out to you. This is an excellent opportunity to speak with someone who has already donated a kidney and can not only answer your non-medical questions, but share more about their experience as a donor. If you have medical questions, we can connect you to the appropriate team member at the University of Utah Health.

WHAT HAPPENS IF DAWN DOES NOT FIND A LIVING KIDNEY DONOR?

The ideal outcome is for Dawn is to find a living donor. She has already battled so much with her kidney disease that being on the kidney transplant waiting list for 3-5 years is simply not ideal. Long-term dialysis is also not ideal as it can lead to a variety of complications such as low blood pressure, injection site infection, and blood clots.







WHAT ELSE CAN I DO TO HELP?
