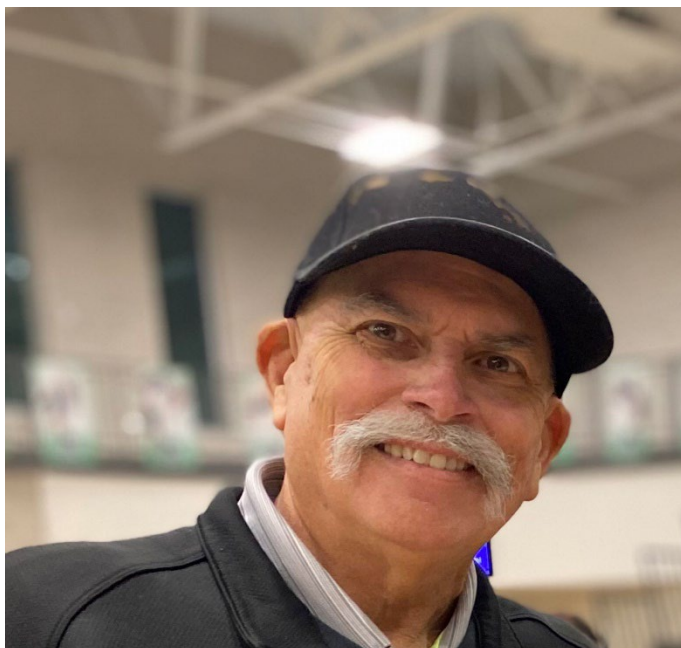
*Know that even thinking about being Randy’s living kidney donor is a courageous step and we are grateful for you!*

### UPDATES

Randy has struggled with health issues since he was just 17 years old. In 2020, it was discovered that UTIs and infections had led to Randy’s kidneys being permanently damaged. Randy was told to apply to get on the kidney transplant waiting list and started dialysis in 2022. He has been slowly improving over the past 5 months, but he will need a kidney transplant to fully heal.

### WHY A LIVING DONOR?

Waiting 3-5 years for a kidney from a deceased donor is not the best path forward for Randy. With a living donor, Randy can get his kidney transplant sooner! Research has shown that when patients receive a kidney from a living donor, the outcome is generally better. Living kidney donation is also ideal because kidneys from living donors last longer and there is a lower chance Randy’s immune system will attack his new kidney (rejection).



### DID YOU STEP FORWARD IN THE PAST?

# COMMON QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

## WAS RANDY'S FAMILY TESTED?

Some family has stepped forward, but we still have not found a living donor match for Randy. In some cases, the best living donor is one who is not a family member, even when family members do step forward to donate.

## DO I NEED INSURANCE TO DONATE?

Yes, the hospital requires that you have insurance to be considered as a living donor in the event an unknown health issues comes up for the donor.

## WHAT ABOUT MY EXPENSES?

While Randy's insurance covers all costs related to the donation (for Randy and the donor), there are expenses like travel, meals, and lost wages that Randy and his family can legally reimburse you for. There are also additional resources available to ensure you are not paying for anything out of pocket. We can provide more information on those resources.

## WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS TO DONATE?

The following are pre-qualification requirements for living donation: must be between the age of 18-69 years old, must be healthy and free of major health problems such as high blood pressure, diabetes, heart disease, and obesity (BMI of 37 or less), and must be mentally and emotionally healthy.

## HOW LONG IS THE RECOVERY PROCESS?

Living kidney donors are often able to return to work within 2 weeks, and fully heal within 6-8 weeks. After surgery, the donor's remaining kidney will also grow in size and function, allowing them to live normal life with just one kidney.

## I HAVE NON-MEDICAL QUESTIONS ABOUT BECOMING A DONOR?

[Visit Randy's kidney website](#) and complete the contact form. Within 1 business day, a donor advocate named Laurie will reach out to you. This is an excellent opportunity to speak with someone who has already donated a kidney and can not only answer your non-medical questions, but share more about their experience as a donor. If you have medical questions, we can connect you to the appropriate team member at the University of Utah Health.

## WHAT HAPPENS IF RANDY DOES NOT FIND A LIVING KIDNEY DONOR?

The ideal outcome for Randy is to find a living donor. He has already battled so much with his kidney disease that being on the transplant waiting list for 3-5 years is simply not ideal. Long-term dialysis is also not ideal as it can lead to a variety of complications such as low blood pressure, injection site infection, and blood clots.
